Our flagship in Detroit's Midtown. An 877-bed tertiary care hospital, education and research complex recognized for clinical excellence and innovation in cardiology and cardiovascular surgery, neurology and neurosurgery, orthopedics and sports medicine, organ transplants, and treatment for prostate, breast and lung cancers. A Level 1 trauma center and one of the largest U.S. teaching hospitals.

Henry Ford Allegiance

A 475-bed health care organization in Jackson. Caring for south central Michigan residents since 1918. Provides comprehensive, advanced inpatient and outpatient care. Recognized for neurosurgery, cancer, stroke and cardiovascular care. An integrated network of physicians serves more than 40 facilities, including a Level II trauma center. A graduate medical education program provides hands-on opportunities. A national leader in forming community partnerships to promote wellness and prevention through our Health Improvement Organization.

Henry Ford Macomb Hospitals

A 361-bed hospital in Clinton Township. Provides comprehensive, advanced care and recognized for cardiovascular care, cancer care, orthopedics, quality, stroke, trauma care and women's health. A Level II trauma center. Health centers in Bruce Township, Chesterfield Township, Fraser, Richmond, Shelby Township and Washington Township offer outpatient and primary care services. A 90-bed hospital in Mount Clemens provides inpatient psychiatric care.

Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital

A 401-bed hospital in Wyandotte. Provides comprehensive, advanced care and recognized for cardiovascular care, psychiatric care, rehab, stroke and women's health. A Level III trauma center. Henry Ford Medical Center-Brownstown provides 24-hour emergency care, medical imaging, outpatient surgery, sleep center and women's health.

Henry Ford West Bloomfield Hospital

A 191-bed hospital with all private rooms in West Bloomfield. Provides comprehensive, advanced care and recognized for children's and women's health, cancer, cardiovascular care, neurosciences and orthopedics. Nutrition, weight management and health classes taught in a 90-seat auditorium. A greenhouse grows produce for patients, staff and community. A Level III trauma center.

Henry Ford Kingswood Hospital

A 100-bed hospital in Ferndale provides inpatient psychiatric care for children, adolescents and adults with acute episodes of mental illness, dual diagnosis and 24-hour intake.

Heart & Vascular Institute

A leader and innovator in comprehensive care, research and education offering one of the nation's largest and most successful heart failure and transplant programs. Specialties include electrophysiology, heart valve replacement, interventional cardiology, rehab, cardiac and vascular surgery and preventive services such as Heart Smart[®] education.

Henry Ford Cancer Institute

Highly skilled doctors, researchers, nurse navigators and other health care specialists provide cancer care to thousands of patients each year. Features include Precision Medicine, complex surgical care, robotic surgery, iMRI, Edge[®] Radiosurgery System, ViewRay MRIdian Linac[®], chemotherapy, clinical trials and support groups. The Brigette Harris Cancer Pavilion is set to open in 2020.

Maplegrove Center

A nationally recognized center for chemical dependency services treating adults, adolescents and their families on the campus of the Henry Ford West Bloomfield Hospital. Maplegrove offers a continuum of clinical care options including residential, outpatient and daily treatment, early intervention services and community education. Maplegrove is part of Henry Ford Behavioral Health, which also includes the Department of Psychiatry and seven outpatient clinics.

Henry Ford Medical Group

One of the nation's largest group practices, with more than 1,594 physicians and researchers in more than 40 specialties who staff Henry Ford Hospital, Henry Ford West Bloomfield Hospital and 30 Henry Ford medical centers in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. Three medical centers provide 24-hour emergency care and outpatient surgery. Some Medical Group physicians are also on staff at other Henry Ford hospitals.





Neuroscience Institute

One of the top programs in the country that includes a National Institutes of Health stroke care and research center, a comprehensive epilepsy and Parkinson's disease treatment and surgery program, one of the largest neurosurgery spine programs in Michigan, and the Hermelin Brain Tumor Center. New imaging technology gives physicians enhanced imaging scans before and during operations to remove tumors.

Orthopedic Surgery

One of the largest and most advanced orthopedic groups in the country, we specialize in all areas of orthopedics including cancer, joint replacement, spine care, sports medicine and trauma. Our motion analysis lab studies the function of human joints and mechanical factors with degenerative joint and soft-tissue diseases. Our sports medicine team of specialists care for patients and professional, collegiate and high school athletes in the metro Detroit area. Our new William Clay Ford Center for Athletic Medicine is a leading, comprehensive sports medicine, treatment and rehab facility.

Transplant Institute

Performs organ transplantation of the liver, kidney, pancreas, intestine, lung and heart, as well as bone marrow stem cells. We are the most comprehensive multiorgan transplant program in Michigan, and use effective clinical strategies to increase transplant rates while maintaining superior patient outcomes.

Vattikuti Urology Institute

The first organized robotic prostatectomy program in the world, the Vattikuti Urology Institute has performed more than 10,000 robotic prostatectomies to date – one of the highest volumes worldwide. It is a leading center in new imagingguided targeted diagnostics and advance treatments to minimize side the effects of prostatectomy.

Henry Ford Physician Network

A physician-led Henry Ford subsidiary that comprises more than 2,200 Henry Ford Medical Group, hospital-employed and private practice physicians. The network focuses on delivering high quality care while reducing medical costs through collaborative best practices, evidence-based medicine and improved efficiency.

Community Network

More than 1,800 additional private practice physicians are affiliated with Henry Ford Macomb, West Bloomfield and Wyandotte hospitals and Henry Ford Allegiance Health.

Research, Education, and Innovation

Teaching, research and advanced patient care make Henry Ford a premier academic medical center. We provide innovative physician training programs, and initiate and collaborate on leading-edge medical research. Many of our physicians and scientists have academic appointments at Wayne State University School of Medicine and/or other WSU schools/colleges.

Research studies

Henry Ford Medical Group physicians are involved in more than 2,000 ongoing clinical research projects. In addition, 85 full-time research scientists are involved in several hundred individual research projects investigating high blood pressure, heart failure, cancer biology, stroke and brain tumors, bone and joint diseases, immunological basis of diseases, MRI imaging, and public health sciences. Research includes basic science studies with a translational focus (bench to bed-side), clinical research/ clinical trials, and population studies that focus on causes of diseases, disease screening, prevention and management, health economics and health outcomes.

Research funding

We receive more than \$94 million in annual funding from external sources, including the National Institutes of Health (NIH), other governmental sources, businesses and private foundations. In addition, we provides about \$12 million in support of the research enterprise. We rank fourth in Michigan in total NIH funding and rank first in Michigan for NIH-research funding for non-university based health care systems. We are in the top 10% of all institutions granted funding by NIH and U.S. Public Health Service.

Henry Ford Innovations

The flagship of Henry Ford's commitment to innovation. We strive to engineer the future of health care by providing physicians and staff with resources to turn promising ideas into transformative products. We also develop and commercialize Henry Ford's intellectual assets and license them to support new products, devices, therapies and hospitals.

Center for Health Services Research

Conducts research focusing on outcomes, effectiveness and costeffectiveness of the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and management of such diseases as cancer, diabetes, asthma and congestive heart failure as well as common acute conditions.

Education

We are a state and national leader in medical education for medical students, interns, residents and fellows and the continuing education of faculty, affiliated physicians, nurses and allied health professionals. Each year, we train more than 1,800 future physicians. About 40% of all physicians in Michigan formally trained here at some point in their career. Henry Ford Hospital trains more than 900 medical students and more than 675 residents and fellows in 50 accredited programs every year. Henry Ford Allegiance, Henry Ford Macomb and Henry Ford Wyandotte hospitals train more than 100 osteopathic medical students and 200 residents in their 22 accredited programs. In 2018, continuing medical opportunities were provided to more than 70,000 physicians, nurses and allied health professionals. Our Center for Simulation, Education and Research provides more than 14,000 participants a risk-free environment where state-of-the-art computers and mannequins simulate hundreds of medical conditions, allowing health professionals to practice and augment their skills.

Henry Ford at Home, which includes Home Health Care, a Medicare-certified home health agency; e-Home Care with Lifeline emergency alert and Telehealth services; Extended Care, a private duty nursing service; Home Infusion, a high-tech antibiotic therapies and nutritional support program for home bound patients; Hart Medical, a Henry Ford durable medical equipment and supply joint venture; Ambulatory Pharmacies, a retail pharmacy operation; Pharmacy Advantage, a medication mail order and specialty drug provider; Pharmacy Care Management, which determines appropriateness of utilization of pharmacy drug costs for Henry Ford and Health Alliance Plan; Occupational Health, a workplace injury prevention, evaluation, treatment and safety program; PACE Southeast Michigan, a partnership with Presbyterian Villages of Michigan, an alternative to nursing home care, a daycare and health services program for seniors to continue living at home; Henry Ford Hospice, palliative and hospice services in a variety of settings; SandCastles, bereavement support for children, teens and their families; Henry Ford OptimEyes, a partnership with Ophthalmology to provide a full continuum of eye care services; and Behavioral Health Services including local access to inpatient care.

Health Alliance Plan

Health Alliance Plan (HAP), a Henry Ford subsidiary, is a Michigan-based nonprofit health plan that provides health coverage to individuals and companies of all sizes. For nearly 60 years, HAP has partnered with leading doctors and hospitals, employers and community organizations to enhance the health and well-being of its members and the community. HAP offers a product portfolio with six distinct product lines: Group Insured Commercial, Individual, Medicare, Medicaid, Self-Funded and Network Leasing. HAP excels in delivering award-winning preventive services, disease management and wellness programs, as well as personalized customer service.





Community Partnerships

Henry Ford develops innovative ways to address the social, economic and educational issues that affect the health of the metro Detroit community. These include:

Community Health and Social Services (CHASS) Clinic

Provides primary care services to about 1,300 uninsured and underinsured Detroit residents every month. Henry Ford physicians staff the clinic in southwest Detroit.

Generation with Promise

Generation with Promise promotes health and wellness in Detroit and Wayne and Macomb counties. More than 190,000 youth and adults have participated in the program since inception.

School-Based and Community Health

Program Operates 11 child and adolescent health centers that provide primary care services in Detroit and other metro Detroit communities.
