RESEARCH

VisionTech Team presents new reading stand!

The VisionTech Team, led by Dr. Daniel Rathbun, has recently begun presenting its newest device to low vision support groups at the Detroit Institute of Ophthalmology. The Team's document reading stand is a compact case the folds out to hold a smartphone and paper document at the optimal distance and alignment to support 'talking camera' apps like Seeing Al. While other inexpensive options exist, our reading stand was designed with an eye toward portability and durability. It uses rare earth magnets to lock open as well as to secure the document upright while it is being read aloud by the phone. The spring-loaded clamp can grasp nearly any smartphone – even in a bulky case.

Although designed specifically for the blind, the stand is also effective for scanning documents; and allows even the sighted to have a physical document read aloud to them, hands-free.

The 12th The Eye and The Chip World Research Congress


The 12th The Eye and The Chip World Research Congress was held virtually October 3-5, 2021. A daily average of over 100 participants listened to 32 speakers from 17 countries discuss updates on research related to artificial vision. This year a record number of 36 abstracts were submitted for poster presentation. The posters were judged through an online viewing platform and during the virtual poster session. Three posters were selected as winners of monetary awards sponsored by the late Bill Rands and his wife Happy. Dr. Jin believes the experience she gained during the week in Jamaica will help her provide higher quality care to future patients. Elina described the trip to Jamaica as a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for a third-year resident and she looks forward to going back some day to work with the team again.

Dominican Republic Mission Trip

Dr. Kim Le, Henry Ford pediatric Ophthalmology, and her husband, Dr. Xihui Lin, Kresge retina specialist, have been organizing mission trips to the Dominican Republic since 2018. This year was their third trip to the Dominican Republic as part of IOPEN. International Ophthalmologic Philanthropic Expeditions Network (IOPEN) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization created by Dr. Lin with a focus on surgical ophthalmic mission work. The first year, it was just Dr. Le, her husband and a private cataract surgeon. The second year they added 3 more surgeons, a scrub tech and two residents, including Dr. Desiree Albert. This year the group included Dr. Le, Dr. Dan Steen, Dr. Jen Aye, Dr. Elina Jin and nine other surgeons and nurses from Kresge Eye Institute, Detroit Medical Center and NYC Retina. The group participated in a 7-day surgical eye trip from September 11 - 18, 2021. With the support of SEE International and generous donations from Alcon as well as support from Vortex Surgical and New World Medical, the group of fourteen was able to complete 102 surgeries in five days. This included 51 cataract surgeries in which more than 70% met criteria of legal blindness prior to surgery. Additionally, nine strabismus surgeries, twelve glaucoma surgeries, and 30 retinal surgeries were performed. Surgical care was provided for both the underserved Dominican population and the undocumented Haitian population.

Although a significant number of surgeries were performed by the small team in a just a few days, there is still a large unmet need for ocular surgical care in the Dominican Republic. Overall, there are an estimated 4,000 strabismus patients and nearly one million cataract patients without access to surgical eye care. The plan for 2022 will include cataract, strabismus, retina, glaucoma and oculoplastic surgeons and they will stay for a full week. Click here to see more photos.


AAO Henry Ford Ophthalmology Alumni reception
