Mental health conditions are considered the top medical complication of pregnancy and the postpartum period, with suicide being a leading cause of maternal mortality in the United States. This webinar will discuss the unique concerns related to mental health conditions during pregnancy and postpartum and evidence-based approaches that can be implemented in healthcare systems to prevent, identify, and treat perinatal mental health conditions.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr. Amy Loree is an Associate Scientist in the Center for Healthcare Improvement at Henry Ford Health, and Associate Research Professor in the Departments of Obstetrics, Gynecology & Reproductive Biology and Pediatrics & Human Development at Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. Dr. Loree's primary clinical and research interests focus on prevention, identification, and treatment of mental health and substance use disorders during the perinatal period. She has led or collaborated on a range of federal- and foundation-funded projects that are rooted in patient and community engagement and use health services and intervention research to improve health outcomes for individuals with mental health and substance use disorders. Many of her projects involve implementing technology-based approaches (e.g., telehealth, mHealth) and integrated care models to facilitate access to evidence-based care. She is also a licensed clinical psychologist and certified perinatal mental health professional through Postpartum Support International, and a member of the Michigan Maternal Mortality Review Committee.
