Providers will stage the patient's cancer through the Problem List function within the Visit Navigator. The staging of the cancer cannot happen until a stageable cancer diagnosis is entered into the Problem List.

- 1. Click on the **Problem List Activity** within the Visit Navigator.
- 2. In the Search for New Item field, enter in the appropriate problem and press ENTER.



- 3. Select the problem from the list that displays
- 4. After filling out the required fields in the ICD-10 calculator, click **Accept**.
- 5. Once the diagnosis is documented, an option to "Enter Staging Information" will appear below the diagnosis on the Problem List.

- 6. The staging activity will display on the right side of the screen. To move this activity to a different part of your screen, use the drop down arrow on the activity tab next to "Cancer Staging" to choose were to place the staging form. The clinical staging form is the default for this activity.
- 7. In this activity, the values to calculate a stage can be documented (T,N,M values). There is a "Details section that can be expanded under the calculated stage with a detailed description of the T,N,M, criteria.
