


Title: Staging Cancer

Providers will stage the patient’s cancer through the Problem List function within the Visit Navigator. The staging of the cancer cannot happen until a stageable cancer diagnosis is entered into the Problem List.

Try It Out

1. Click on the **Problem List Activity** within the Visit Navigator.
2. In the Search for New Item field, enter in the appropriate problem and press **ENTER**.

4. After filling out the required fields in the ICD-10 calculator, click **Accept**.
5. Once the diagnosis is documented, an option to “Enter Staging Information” will appear below the diagnosis on the Problem List.

- The staging activity will display on the right side of the screen. To move this activity to a different part of your screen, use the drop down arrow on the activity tab next to “Cancer Staging” to choose where to place the staging form. The clinical staging form is the default for this activity.
- In this activity, the values to calculate a stage can be documented (T,N,M values). There is a “Details” section that can be expanded under the calculated stage with a detailed description of the T,N,M, criteria.

Change your cancer staging from Clinical to Pathologic. As well as, change your staging form to another version.

1. Using the green plus sign, once in the cancer staging activity, pathologic staging can be added.
2. Also, by selecting the drop down arrow next to your form, an alternative version of the staging form can be selected.
3. If this plan needs to be routed to another provider, using the “Envelope button with an Arrow”, the staging can be sent to another provider using Epic.
