Next up, we are presenting a topic that, sadly, impacts too many of us in the healthcare industry. Whether it is because of the internalized fear from enduring years of COVID-19 loss and protocols, or perhaps a larger societal sense of discontent, we are seeing more and more of our colleagues on the receiving end of aggressive encounters from patients or their family members/caregivers.



The next webinar – titled <u>De-escalation: Recognizing and Mitigating Potentially Dangerous Encounters in</u> <u>Your Medical Setting</u> – will take place on **Tuesday, August 29 from noon to 1 p.m.** It is intended to equip attendees with ways to recognize potentially dangerous situations and how to de-escalate them. It will also address how patient care is negatively impacted when healthcare workers do not feel safe.

This free webinar is open to *any* healthcare team members who interact with patients, their family members or caregivers. We are opening this webinar to a larger audience because, as we know all too well, anger and aggression can be directed at anyone within our clinical setting, whether it is a greeter, physician, medical assistant or front desk team member.

The keynote speaker at this webinar will be **Judy Arnetz**, **PhD**, **MPH**, **PT**, who is professor and Associate Chair for Research in the Department of Family Medicine at Michigan State College of Human Medicine. Dr. Arnetz's research focus and area of expertise is how the well-being and safety of healthcare workers impacts the quality of patient care and how to prevent/mitigate the effects of violence in healthcare settings.

We ask that you share this educational opportunity with anyone in your office, clinic or practice who wants to learn more about how to recognize and deescalate if a situation escalates.
