Caregiver Tip:

"Accept help from others. Don't feel like you have to do everything and be physically present with the person you are caring for 100 percent of the time. If someone asks, "What can I do to help?" give them something to do. They can sit with the person you care for so you can grocery shop, run errands or do something fun. Ask them to accompany your loved one to the doctor, mow the lawn, or bring you a coffee. When people are needed, they are more likely to offer to help again. Accepting their help doesn't mean you are weak or incapable, it means you understand that helping yourself and practicing self-love allows you to be a better caregiver. Remember, just because you are the primary caregiver, doesn't mean you have to be the only caregiver."
