EyesOn Design Awards

Celebrating its 12th year, EyesOn Design helps raise money for the nonprofit Detroit Institute of Ophthalmology and focuses on style, how cars look. The awards themselves are elegantly designed and created using optical crystal.

At this year's EyesOn Design, lifetime design achievement honoree, Ed Welburn, Jr. presented his father Ed Welburn, Sr. with the 2018 Catalyst award. Mr. Welburn credited his dad, now 99 years old, with showing him how to illustrate cars, taking him to drag races and auto shows and working with him in the little shop they had in the basement of their home.

More than 30 of the best designers and academics in the auto business selected the winners from the first reveals at the 2018 North American International Auto Show on Tuesday, January 16. This year, the designers noticed that rich colors such as pearly white, gold and champagne are favored colors along with technology highlights such as LED tail lights that flash and dance and big trucks that have been sculpted more than ever before.

Pat Schiavone, an award judge and former Ford truck designer, said he noticed that one of the biggest changes is how much attention automakers are giving truck designs and how futuristic-looking cars are becoming. "There are some really interesting technologies that are having an impact on the aesthetics," he said. "It's a movement that's going to go somewhere. We're going to see cars that look like they should be flying."







Poonam Bansal, M.D. As a child, whenever Dr. Bansal

was asked about her life's aim, she would answer without slightest hesitation, "A Doctor". Her opportunity came when she secured admission at Nalanda Medical College, in Patna, Bihar, India. She then qualified, via a very competitive examination, for admission in Ophthalmology residency at Patna Medical College and Hospital. Dr. Bansal and her husband came to the United States to further their studies and careers. She did her fellowship in Neuro-ophthalmology at Henry Ford Hospital from Nov. 2011- June 2013 with Dr. Skarf and completed her Neurology residency at Wayne State University, graduating recently in 2017.

It was during medical school that Dr. Bansal became fascinated by the mechanics and functioning of the eye. She comments, "Though a very small part of the body, it is baffling that the eye receptors can transduce light signals along its axons enabling us to visually experience what we have around us." After an opportunity during medical school to attend an eye camp for cataract surgery organized by the Lions Club in India, it dawned on her that this was one of the noblest branches of medicine.

Dr. Bansal enjoys practicing Neuro-ophthalmology, a unique and highly specialized area of medicine. "It's very rewarding to me when I'm able to provide an answer and explanation to the patient and other physicians about the disease process affecting the patient's eye and/or brain." In addition to her Ophthalmology responsibilities, she practices Neurology for one week each month.



Matt Toigo, COT It wasn't until after he had completed two years at Henry Ford College, transferred to Ferris State University and managed a printing shop, that Matt Toigo became interested in Ophthalmology. He returned to Henry Ford College to study Ophthalmology. Matt did his clinical externship in a clinic in Pontiac, Michigan before starting his career at Henry Ford Health System. As a Certified Ophthalmic Technician (COT) Matt works in all the sub-specialties of Ophthalmology with a strong focus on cornea.

Matt enjoys the atmosphere at work, especially because he works with some of his classmates. He is also very proud that he "gets to help people get their sight back."

Of all the five senses, Matt believes vision is the most important. Matt knows first-hand that not everyone is fortunate to have full vision, such as his future father-in-law who is aphakic and has a prosthetic left eye.

Matt is encouraged by the advancements that have been made in the realm of ophthalmology, from clinical to surgical, and everything in between. He says, "The outcomes are very rewarding, knowing how we help people see every day." Matt finds the advancements of corneal transplantation most amazing. Listening to and being taught by Dr. Steen, Dr. Amin and Dr. Jaber about cross linking, PKP, DMEK and DSAEK, Matt says, "One can only imagine what the future holds."

On a personal note, Matt shared that in June of this year he will be a post-op kidney transplant recipient for 15 years. He thinks that may be why he likes corneal transplantation so much!
