Echocardiogram Instructions



Below is information to prepare you for your echocardiogram. Talk to your doctor if you have questions or concerns.

What is an echocardiogram?

An echocardiogram is an ultrasound of the heart that shows how your blood flows through the heart and heart valves.

How is the test done?

- You will have a 3-lead heart monitor put on your chest and a sonographer (health care professional that specializes in medical imaging) will use an ultrasound probe to take pictures of the heart.
- Expect to be at the hospital for about 1 hour the day of your test.

How do I get ready for the test?

✓ Arrive 15 minutes before your appointment	× Do not use lotion or oil on your chest or

✓ Take all your medicines as you normally do.	
✓ You can eat and drink normally.	

Is there any medicine used during this test?

- It is possible that you will need an imaging agent medicine called Definity® to see the walls of your heart better with the ultrasound.
- If it is needed, you will get an IV to start medicines.
- There are rarely side effects to this medicine. The team will talk to you about any possible side effects at the time of your test.

What if I need to cancel or reschedule?

- Try to cancel at least 24 hours before your appointment if possible.
- If you are more than 15 minutes late you will have to reschedule
